Airport Crack Seal

Development Services Director Leavens addressed the city council stating that the purpose of this agenda item is to seek council approval for crack sealing at the airport. There were many bid packets sent out for these services. There was only one bid received back for these services. The purpose of this item is to gain the City Council's approval of a bid to seal cracks in the airport runway, taxiway and aprons. The city issued a request for proposals to seal cracks in the runway, taxiway, and aprons of the city's Hugh Robinson Airport. The project was divided into four project areas. A total of eighteen bid packets were sent out to area businesses providing this service. Only one completed bid packet was returned. Springfield Striping and Sealing submitted a bid for each of the project areas as follows: Runway: \$26,416.00; Taxiway: \$51,415.00; North Hanger Apron: \$23,796.80; for a total project cost of \$101,627.80.

Bill No. 2024-71: Hickory Avenue partial Right-of-Way Abandonment for Habitat for Humanity

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Neosho declaring a certain right-of-way surplus and abandoning and vacating the west Twenty-Five Feet of right-of-way of Hickory Street between Mary Avenue and Jefferson Avenue and authorizing the same to revert to the abutting property owners.

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Neosho to amend the zoning District Map for certain property within the limits of the City located at the 722 South College, Neosho, Missouri, as requested by the owner, Fleshman Family Farm, LLC, a Missouri Limited Liability Company, from a District "R-1" First Dwelling House District to a District "R-2" Second Dwelling House District.

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Title III Traffic Code, of the Code of Ordinances by repealing and replacing Section 340.120 Off Road Vehicles, Allowed—Exceptions, Prohibited Uses for adding exceptions of Utility Vehicles and Golf Carts on City Streets.

AN ORDINANCE of the City of Neosho authorizing Change Order No. 2 for an Agreement for Construction Services with Jeff Asbell Excavating & Trucking, Inc., a Missouri Corporation for cost overrun in the amount of Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-One and 26/100 Dollars (\$15,451.26) and authorizing the Mayor to execute the same by and on behalf of the City of Neosho; and containing an emergency provision.

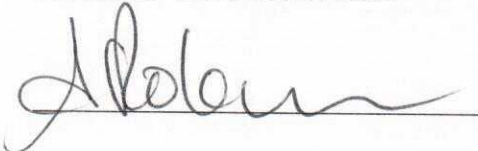

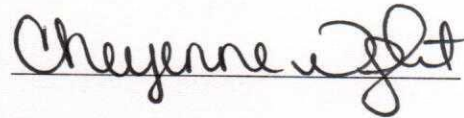
